
Rapid City Chapter of NPM



2021 Fall Meeting - 30th Anniversary Celebration - St. Cecilia Banquet

Excitement ... gratitude ... celebration ... renewing old / making new friendships ... time with fellow music ministers ... These were some of the many comments heard by attendees of our 2021 Fall Meeting, held Oct 8-9 at the Cathedral of Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Rapid City. Nearly 50 attendees gathered from across the diocese and beyond, including Gillette and Huron, to attend the event showcasing presentations by Dr. Daniel Girardot of Austin, TX, a nationally-known speaker, professor of music and liturgy, conductor, choral clinician and long-time member of NPM, serving on national committees and advisory boards for the NPM organization.

Friday evening, Dr. Girardot led 25-30 attendees in a spiritual retreat entitled, “Awake the Soul: Music Ministry as a Spiritual Practice.” Through stories, song, and touching anecdotes, Dr. Girardot shared valuable strategies and insights to seek/establish Intimacy with God, Examine the Prayer Life, and Create a Spiritual Plan of Action. The theme emphasized focus on God, and not oneself, at the center of one’s life. Discussion on this objective included identifying what keeps us from an intimate relationship with God, seeking spiritual direction (through spiritual directors or spiritual companions), developing/enforcing habits of prayer – which also addressed differing prayer forms for different personality types. Retreat attendees came away with a renewed peace and purpose to enrich their approach to music ministry.

Saturday was chock-full of events, as additional attendees arrived for three presentations by Dr. Girardot. Following a welcome message from Fr. Matt Fallgren and opening prayer led by musicians from St. Michaels, Dr. Girardot began his discussion on Best Practices for Music Ministry in COVID Times and Beyond. While he addressed aerosol transmission studies and cautionary strategies (distancing between singers, singers’ masks, etc.), Dr. Girardot placed particular focus on “how do you encounter Christ in your life and in your ministry,” expanding on reflections on service in ministry and Mystagogical Catechesis. This generated a variety of touching and profound observations from attendees.

Next, Dr. Girardot gave a well-rounded presentation on Small Choir, Big Music: Care & Feeding of Rural Pastoral Musicians. Core to this discussion was assessment of parish music ministry needs, including a collaborative exercise with the pastor and with parish leadership, incorporating the **STRIPE** process: **S** (Situation); **T** (Target); **R** (Restraining forces); **I** (Ideas); **P** (Practice); **E** (Evaluate). This was partnered with a ‘survival guide’ for priests and music ministers, emphasizing the need to work together, being both a person of prayer and being a musician, strategies on music selection (utilizing Sing To The Lord: Music In Divine Worship), accountability (of priest and music ministers) to one another. It was a powerhouse of valuable information.

Following a delicious meal prepared by Olive Garden, we moved to the business meeting and awards portion of the banquet. Pat McDowell was elected to a 2nd 2-yr term as Chapter Co-Director. Jeanine Gerlach was elected to a 2nd 2-yr term as Co-Programming Coordinator. The Secretary/Treasurer position is currently unfilled, and Carman Timmerman was appointed as Chapter Historian.

Attendees who have served as chapter board members, as well as those who were past award recipients, were asked to stand in special recognition for their service to our chapter over the past 30+ years. A special shout-out was given to Jackie Schnittgrund and Therese Kaiser, two of the founding members of the Rapid City NPM Chapter. Bishop Peter Muhich was on hand to lead a commissioning of all music ministers, which included special prayers for our music ministers who have passed away in 2020/2021 – Luanne Russell (Blessed Sacrament-RC), Roy Brumbaugh (OLPH-RC), and Thomas Bommersbach (OLPH-RC).

Dr. Dan Girardot then led the final presentation of the day, a music-reading session which incorporated skill-building techniques for both Directors and Cantors. This included a review of the four movements of the Mass, multiple tips on the vocal mechanics of singing, and compelling reflections on the Eucharistic Liturgy. All these items, coupled with outstanding selections of music, provided an informative and entertaining afternoon for all.

Throughout the day, a slideshow provided photos from events through our chapter's 30-year history. In addition, attendees were given opportunities to review and place bids on a marvelous collection of items donated for our Silent Auction fundraiser. With over 70 items up for bids, it resulted in over \$1,400 of funds raised for our chapter ... a record-breaking total! Thanks to your generosity, these funds will help offset costs to bring in future national speakers for our Fall banquet.

What a joyful gathering and celebration for our diocesan musicians! We encourage all Rapid City Diocese music ministers and clergy to attend quarterly NPM meetings at which education, prayer and fellowship are the focal points. Newsletter Distribution Update

For a number of years, we have published hard copies of our quarterly chapter newsletter and mailed it to music ministers and churches throughout the diocese. Costs for printing and mailing the newsletter were initially handled through our chapter's available funds, then were later absorbed into church expenses at Blessed Sacrament Church. This generous action by the priests at the church at that time enabled us to allocate more funding toward bringing in many of the wonderful national speakers you have enjoyed meeting and learning from at our Fall meetings, or for cantor workshops for youth and adults.

This past year, funding by Blessed Sacrament Church for our newsletter's printing and mailing expenses was discontinued. We explored other options through other Rapid City parishes and through the diocesan office, but with little or no success. Given the increasing costs for printing and mailing, while we have accrued enough funds to publish hard copies of our quarterly newsletters through 2022, doing so will diminish funds we would normally allocate toward expenses in bringing in national speakers for learning/training opportunities for our diocesan musicians.

Given the growing local and national trends for more digital distribution of news and periodicals, we would like to transition to digital distribution of our chapter's quarterly newsletters. We already archive electronic copies of our newsletters in our chapter's website, and we now would like to email our diocesan musicians with a link to our website, for you to easily read current and prior newsletters.

Here's where we need your help. Of the nearly 390 individuals and churches currently on our mailing list, we only have email addresses for just over 200 of them. We are asking if you can please provide

contact lists (email addresses, phone numbers) of your current (and retired) music ministers in your parishes. We will match this information to our existing records, then update (or append) email contact information. Please be assured the master list we have at this time has never been used for anything beyond providing us a contact list to convey chapter news and updates to you. We do not share it with any external resources or organizations.

Bonnie will update the master list and will provide an update by mid-2022 to indicate how close we are to having a full listing of emails for our diocesan musicians.

Thank you for your help in this effort! For all of you who have had opportunity to see and learn from Dr. Dan Girardot, Lee Gwodz, Leah Sedlacek, or Dr. Tom Porter (to name a few), we want to continue providing you opportunities to engage with and learn from these marvelous individuals who are leaders in Catholic music across our country. This effort to move to digital new distributions will allow us to do just that!
