<u>Left:</u> O God, be gracious and bless us, And let your face shed its light upon us. <u>Right:</u> So will your ways be known upon earth, And all nations learn your saving help. <u>Left:</u> Let the peoples praise you, O God; Let all the peoples praise you. <u>Right:</u> Let the nations be glad and exult, For you rule the world with justice. <u>Left:</u> With fairness you rule the peoples, You guide the nations on earth. <u>Right:</u> Let the peoples praise you, O God; Let all the peoples praise you. <u>Left:</u> The earth has yielded its fruit, For God, our God, has blessed us. <u>Right:</u> May God still give us his blessing till the ends of the earth revere him.

(Pause) Sun of Justice, the immaculate Virgin was the white dawn announcing your rising, <u>All:</u> Grant that we may always live in the light of your coming.

<u>Reader:</u> Eternal Word, you chose Mary as the uncorrupted ark of your dwelling place, <u>All:</u> Free us from the corruption of sin.

<u>Reader:</u> Savior of mankind, your mother stood at the foot of your cross, <u>All:</u> Grant, through her intercession, that we may rejoice to share in your passion.

<u>Reader:</u> With ultimate generosity and love, you gave Mary as a mother to your beloved disciple, <u>All:</u> Help us to live as worthy children of so noble a mother.

Concluding Prayer

<u>Reader:</u> Lord, we praise you with our lips, and with our lives and hearts. Our very existence is a gift from you; to you we offer all that we have and are. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, God, forever and ever. *All:* Amen.
