He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty.


He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he has remembered his promise of mercy, the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children forever.

health? Are you not happily

within my fold? What else do you wish? Do not grieve nor be disturbed by anything.
