
Preview: 2025 Summer Meeting

Recap: 2025 Spring Meeting

The Spring Meeting was held 22 March at St. Francis of Assisi Church, Sturgis. Events included, in order: Liturgy Basics (Dcn. John Osnes, OLBH, Piedmont), New Music in Breaking Bread (Terry Schroeder, St. Therese, Rapid City), Simplified Mass Arrangements & WCDF Grant (Carman Timmerman and Terry Schroeder, both, St. Therese, Rapid City), and Lenten/Easter Music Showcase/Sing Along (Barry Furze, St. Francis, Sturgis; Teresa Spiess & Justin Stephens, Blessed Sacrament, Rapid City; Chantry Nelson, St. Michael's, Hermosa).

First, Musicians from St. Francis of Assisi, Sturgis led Opening Prayer.

Deacon Osnes (OLBH, Piedmont) gave a nuanced talk on "Liturgy Basics" liberally sprinkled with quotes from our last three popes and from church documents. He detailed his journey from Protestant choir directing to his call to the Catholic deaconate – and then from a posture of "liturgical policeman" to a prioritization of the bigger picture: that the role of the liturgy is to help us "see beyond the externals and enter into the eternal" (Pope Benedict XVI). The role of Church music (and church musicians) is to facilitate the liturgy and thus this seeing. "So how do we [do that]?" he asked. "Every church has its own culture...so it's a very challenging thing to be a pastoral musician."

In "New Music in Breaking Bread," Terry Schroeder (St. Therese, Rapid City) led participants through eight new songs in the 2025 edition of Breaking Bread: #214 Be Not Far from Me (Smith); #683 I Know That My Redeemer Lives (Whitaker); #363 Not by Bread Alone (Hurd); #459 Keep Me in Your Heart (Whitaker); #366 The Feast Meant for Everyone (Booth and Hart); #491 The Table of the Lord (Catherine and Hart), and two hymns suitable for Holy Week: #166 This Is the Wood/Mirad la Cruz (Fernández), and her personal favorite, #361 Are You Ready to Drink the Cup (Consiglio).

Carman Timmerman, aided by Terry Schroeder (both, St. Therese, Rapid City), briefly detailed the chapter's commissioning and legal licensing of **elementary-leve**l keyboard (and guitar chord) **arrangements of four commonly-used masses**:

- Heritage Mass (Alstott), two versions:
 - "chord" arr. by Barry Furze and Wayne Richards
 - "melodic" arr. by Sue Sedlacek
- Mass of Christ the Savior (Schutte), arr. Sue Sedlacek
- Mass of Creation (Haugen), arr. Sue Sedlacek
- Mass of Renewal (Stephan), arr. Sue Sedlacek

On all arrangements, Ed Fischer edited the guitar chords and Sedlacek set the finished music in MuseScore.

Schroeder played through selected mass movements while attendees sang along.

These arrangements are now printed and available through the Rapid City Chapter, NPM. All were on display for pickup both at the business meeting and at the end of the day.

The day's final presentation was a **"Lenten/Easter Music" showcase/sing-along, featuring seasonal music from three parishes**: St. Francis (Sturgis), Blessed Sacrament (Rapid City), and St. Michael (Hermosa).

Barry Furze presented three favorite seasonal hymns of the St. Francis congregation (all in blue Gather hymnal): #158 Remember Your Love, #159 Deep Within, and #357 Healer of Every Ill.

Teresa Spiess and Justin Stephens presented part of the Good Friday Reproaches, the SATB anthem Adoramus te Christe (Dubois), the Hosanna chant for Palm Sunday, the Procession Form 1 from the Roman Missal, and two hymns from the Credo hymnal: #229 Festival Canticle: Worthy Is Christ and #497 I Know a Lamb.

Chantry Nelson presented three hymns from St. Michael, Hermosa's in-house Communion Hymn Supplement Booklet: #6, Godhead Here in Hiding (ADORO TE DEVOTE) #12 Lord Enthroned in Heavenly Splendor (BRYN CALFARIA), and #4 Come Down O Love Divine (DOWN AMPNEY).

Categories are:

St. Cecilia Award (Clergy and Laity): Recognizes one clergy member and one lay person for exceptional contributions to liturgy and music.

Criteria: Nominee need not meet all criteria:

- 1. NPM national member (preferred).
- 2. Recognized role in West River music ministry (i.e. director, organist, pianist, pastor, cantor, choir member) for 5 years or more.
- 3. Specific exceptional contribution(s) that enliven music liturgy and aid in developing liturgical resources.
- 4. Example(s) of providing support to parish musicians, clergy and other worship leaders as the nominee fosters the art of liturgical music involvement.

J Peggy Langenfeld Memorial: Recognizes one person or organization who has promoted NPM and chapter activities in an extraordinary way.

Criteria: Nominee need not meet all criteria:

- 1. NPM national member (preferred).
- 2. Promotion of NPM at parish and diocesan level.
- 3. Participation in one or more meeting programs.
- 4. Current or past officer in Rapid City NPM Chapter.

J Emerging Music Minister Award: Recognizes an adult or youth who shows promise as a musician contributing to Catholic music liturgy.

Criteria:

- 1. Service of five or fewer years (consider length and breadth, participation in other ministries).
- 2. Commitment (i.e. consistent involvement).
- 3. Demonstration of continued learning in music liturgy.
- 4. Demonstration of initiative.

Age Categories:

- 1. Emerging Adult: Person 24 years or older.
- 2. Emerging Youth: Person 16 23 years old.

Service Year Awards: Recognizes a person who has contributed their time and music talents to church music for a number of years (or slightly more).

Year categories: 5, 10, 25, 40, 50, 60, 70, and 80 years.
